Last Friday evening they sang carols at the Ewell Yule in Ewell High Street and on Wednesday this week the older members of the choir sang at the Ashley Centre in Epsom to raise funds for a portable Vapotherm machine which will enable babies and children in respiratory distress to be transferred from Paediatric A&E to the Paediatric Ward at Epsom Hospital. The children sang beautifully, received an enormous number of compliments and raised £283.24 for this excellent cause. FIRST WORLD WAR CENTENARY WOOD

The Woodland Trust have over 10,000 tree saplings to plant in Langley Vale Wood and are asking families to put on their wellies and join them on Saturday 17th December to help create a living tribute to all those who served in the First World War. The Woodland Trust's Centenary Woods Project seeks to commemorate the First World War - creating a living legacy that can grow and thrive for future generations. Langley Vale is the Woodland Trust's 640 acre flagship site for England, and will be planted with tens of thousands of native trees and carpets of wildflowers.

The tree planting will be at Langley Vale Wood, KT18 6AP on Saturday 17th December from 10am to 3pm. Booking contact: centralevents@woodlandtrust.org.uk or 0330 333 5302.

Parking is available at Epsom Downs Racecourse, free shuttle buses will provide transport from the racecourse to Langley Vale village where staff will guide you to the planting site—a ten minute walk. They will be running throughout the day so you can plant at a time convenient to you and for as long as you wish. There is no parking on site. Refreshments will be provided. Please bring a spade and gloves if possible. Wellies and all-weather clothing

are advised. Under 16s are welcome but must be accompanied by an adult and there are no dogs allowed.
