

# ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

Medication can only be given with **parental written consent** and parents must complete an official school medication form supplied by the school office. This form (Form 3B) completed by parents gives consent for school staff to administer the medication/inhaler, giving details of medication, dosage, time, expiry date and allergies. It is parents' responsibility to ensure that all medication is in date—including inhalers and Epi-pens.

This rule applies for all 'over the counter' medicines, not just antibiotics or medicines prescribed by a doctor.

If your child needs Calpol, please complete a Form 3B available from the school office and bring the medication to the office with your child's name written on the medicine. We will keep the medicine locked in a cupboard and keep all antibiotics in our staff fridge.

Foster carers, fostered young people and care leavers will talk about what it is like to foster and be fostered with Surrey County Council's fostering service. Young Shakespeare Company came into school on Monday for a performance of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' for Years 4, 5 and 6.

The children were engrossed in the story which was expertly told by a group of very talented actors, a narrator and the children themselves. The cast were able to involve all the children in the story-telling and sound effects which further enhanced their enjoyment and understanding of the play.
