SUMMER UNIFORM

All children should be in their Summer uniform on Tuesday 12th April when we return to school after the Easter holidays. Jewellery (including earrings, necklaces and rings) should not be worn at school. Watches may be worn but must be removed for PE, teachers cannot be held responsible if they are misplaced. Girls need to tie their hair up with practical, plain hair-bands or small hairclips, not anything large please. Tank tops are <u>not</u> part of our uniform and please avoid shorts/trousers with 'cargo' style pockets.

All children need to have a PE kit or red shorts & plain white polo top/white t-shirt, black plimsolls (Years 3-6 trainers optional) for their PE lessons.

Girls

Red/White/Gingham Dress or optional St Clement's polo shirt

Grey trousers/skirt

St Clement's cardigan/jumper (round neck KS1 V-neck KS2) with school name embroidered on the front Black/Brown school shoes (not open toed sandals)

Boys

White St Clement's polo shirt or **optional** white shirt & tie (Years 3-6)

St Clement's round neck jumper (KS1) or v-neck jumper (KS2) with school name embroidered on the front Grey/trousers/shorts (not cargo style)

Black/brown school shoes (not open toed sandals)

Please ensure the correct uniform is worn at all times by your child and that **every item** of uniform is clearly labelled.
