This knowledgeable archaeologist invited Year 4 to become Egyptian explorers with him, to search for artefacts, to re-create a battle and to act out the roles of the Pharaohs. # YEAR 3 TRIP TO CHERTSEY MUSEUM

Dressed as Romans, we made clay coil pots, practised our Latin on wax tablets, went on a hunt for Roman gods and goddesses and had a fascinating talk by an archaeologist using actual Roman artefacts. Impressed by the children’s exemplary behaviour, the museum staff allowed us to have lunch in their beautiful contemplation garden. We then tucked into the delicious Roman banquets provided by our parents. Batteries recharged, we were ready for a busy afternoon handling replica objects, identifying what they were made from, and how the Romans used them.
