All hail Macbeth! (and St Clement's!)










GRANDPARENTS WEEK

EUROPEAN LANGUAGES



Amazingly, we have thirteen European languages spoken by our families at St Clement's, but this year our focus for European Languages Day was French. The children had the opportunity to engage in a variety of fun activities to develop their language skills. Reception were busy painting the French flag and found out about the Eiffel Tower. Year 1 learnt the names of fruits and vegetables in French and then had to guess what Peppa Pig bought at the supermarché! Year 2 learnt a song about greetings. Year 3 played Bingo to help them learn the words for the colours and then went on a colour treasure hunt. Year 4 made posters about the numbers 0 to 10. Year 5 found out about important landmarks in France and Year 6 had to follow instructions and then use their new vocabulary to have mini conversations.





THE POPPY APPEAL

After Half Term we will be collecting for The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Each class will be given their own merchandise and collection box. Suggested donations for these range between 50p and £1 depending on the item. The children must bring their money into school in a plastic zip bag or envelope and they will then be responsible for putting their money into the collection box.



HISTORY WORKSHOPS

Digging for buried treasures, using stone tools, discovering fire, hunting and building Stonehenge were just a few of the activities enjoyed by the Year 3 children in their Prehistory workshop. Archaeologist, Mortimer Wheeler, really brought the past to life in an engaging and memorable way, enhancing our learning about the Stone Age.



The children in Year 4 enjoyed celebrating Ancient Egypt Day. They met Mortimer Wheeler, an Egyptian Archaeologist. Mortimer introduced them to the fascinating history of the Ancient Egyptians including the Pharaohs, the god Rameses, mummification and the famous battles of the day. This knowledgeable archaeologist invited Year 4 to become Egyptian explorers with him, to search for artefacts, to re-create a battle and to act out the roles of the Pharaohs.

The children then learned that the Ancient Egyptians had gods for everything, from dangers to chores, and each had different responsibilities and needed to be worshipped so that life could be kept in balance.



BIKEABILITY

This week, 30 year 6 children took part in the bikeabilty course. They learned a variety of skills on how to ride safely on the surrounding roads. The leaders were very impressed with our cyclists who demonstrated great listening and great determination to follow the instructions safely, despite a week of very changeable weather! They have all learned an extremely valuable skill.


Thank you so much to the team of bikeability leaders. Another job well done! Congratulations year 6!
