Year 6 gained a real insight into the forgotten heroes (e.g. the desert rats). The children were really engaged and Mortimer was really impressed by their knowledge and interest in this subject.






Year 6 had a great time at their skipathon. They skipped for an hour and also did some double dutch skipping. A superb effort Year 6!

ATTENDANCE AWARD




The attendance award this half term has gone to Year 5, Reception and Year 1. They have both received an extra-long playtime.
