<p><b>Priority 5</b> Personal development</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To achieve healthy schools' status.</li> <li>• To carefully track disadvantaged pupils in terms of access to sports clubs – ensure that there are no barriers to taking part.</li> <li>• To liaise with Rowan Ring (Mental Health Nurse – School based needs Team) to ensure identified pupils are accessing the professional support that they need.</li> <li>• To continue to promote healthy living through clubs and the curriculum.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Priority 6</b> Early Years</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To ensure an Increased focus on Understanding the World – particularly focussing on past and present</li> <li>• To carefully consider timetabling to ensure a balanced curriculum</li> <li>• To hold weekly maths meetings to discuss maths mastery and maths vocabulary</li> <li>• EYFS lead to attend NCETM Maths Mastery training (AK)</li> <li>• EYFS Lead to introduce new EYFS RE curriculum (KHS)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Priority 7</b> Premises</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To explore the idea of solar energy to negate the impact of the energy crisis.</li> <li>• Develop the Science Garden</li> <li>• Develop the outdoor space to enhance the classroom environments</li> <li>• Improve the hard playground through the addition of markings for children to play on</li> <li>• Implement rolling programme of painting and decorating of classrooms, corridors and communal areas.</li> <li>• Investigate replacing or repairing the tarmac path in the staff car park.</li> </ul>
